The government is changing Vehicle Excise Duty (VED) for new vehicles registered on or after 1st April 2017.

The government is changing Vehicle Excise Duty (VED) for new vehicles registered on or after 1st April 2017.

This is to address the increasing number of cars registered which are paying little or no VED. It will affect both first year rates and subsequent years. First year VED rates will still vary according to vehicle CO2 emissions, though the amounts charged are changing.

There is then a fixed charge regardless of CO₂ for subsequent years with an additional charge if the vehicle's starting list price irrespective of any discount given is above 40K.
